

% of 5 YEAR OLD CHILDREN WITH DECAYED FILLED OR MISSING TEETH (DMFT)

The chart below shows that the percentage of children aged 5 years old with decayed, filled or missing teeth in Darlington. In 2011/12 there were 29.4% of children in Darlington recorded as having DMFT. This is just below the regional average and above the national rate of 29.7% and significantly worse than the England average of 27.9%. There is no trend data available for this indicator.
